PRICKLY PEAR & CONTROL

Control Costs: can vary depending on the amount of follow-up work required, if previous work has been diligent; little time will be needed to survey the area. (Saving costs)

If initial control was done without considering "Hygiene Practices", the whole infestation site could be covered in broken-off segments; causing multiple plants to grow in the area.









Follow-up Control Work: is costly to undertake when infestations are widespread across a farm or reserve.

Fire Control: is an option when old timber has been piled up for burning, the Prickly pear must be placed (1) on the top (2) left to dry-out (3) cleanup site when fire has been extinguished.

(The Fire Must Burn Hot).

HYGIENE: is the key to good weed management, it might take longer to complete the task - But You Won't Have To Come Back - Small Prickly Pear: segments are not deeply rooted and are simple to remove and dispose of.
