Griffith City Council received \$2.1 million in funding from the NSW Government's Restart NSW Water Security for Regions program for Council's installation of sewerage infrastructure for the villages of Lake Wyangan, Nericon and Tharbogang.

Contract works are progressing well with the following works under way:

Tharbogang

Tharbogang reticulation is complete including the transfer main to the Griffith Water Reclamation Plant. Pressure testing of the reticulation is under way within Tharbogang and customers may have noted staff moving around the village checking boundary kits and purging air from the mains. Fresh water is being used for testing with only small discharges from the system when opened to release trapped air.

Nericon

Installation of the reticulation mains and boundary kits within the Nericon Village is also complete and includes the transfer main along Smeeth Road to the Lake Wyangan Sewer Pump Station at the corner of Smeeth and Boorga roads, Lake Wyangan.

Works along Smeeth Road included 4.4 kilometres of 75mm and 63mm polyethylene mains and fully installed using directional boring techniques.

Reticulation works have also commenced in Lake Wyangan with the installation of reticulation mains and some boundary kits.

The first of the on-property pressure sewer unit installations are scheduled to commence early May 2018 commencing in the Tharbogang Village.

Notifications of the proposed works and communication with the respective land owners/occupiers will be undertaken well in advance, and in accordance with the scheme's communications plan.
