



Operation Art Sensory Tour Information

Thank you for taking the time to enquire or book a sensory tour for the Operation Art exhibition at the Griffith Regional Art Gallery. We feel it is important to provide you with as much information as we can to ensure everyone has an enjoyable experience. Below is a detailed table of the events we have planned to offer additionally to the exhibition during the tour. Tours will be available for the duration of the exhibition on weekdays from Monday 12 August to Friday 13 September. Booking are essential.

Sensory Experience	Description
Sound Buttons	Participants will be able to press sound buttons with recorded sounds that relate to the artworks.
Scented Balls	Small balloons covered in fabric that are dipped in food essence will be passed around to guess the scent. Scents will include natural scents e.g floral, fruits etc.
Sand Play	A sand box with buried small plastic figures to be discovered.
Fan with Spray	A small electric hand fan with a water bottle will be passed around to experience the spray of the ocean breeze.
Torch Light Hand Puppets	Lights in the gallery will be turned off and torches covered with cellophane will be shared with in the group for participants to show off their hand puppets.
Red Dot Scavenger Hunt	Participants will be given red dots and a short list verbally of artworks to discover within the exhibition.

Why choose a sensory tour?

Sensory tours are an interactive way to experience art. It allows the participants to explore the exhibition through senses that are not limited visual e.g. sound, smell and touch.
