Medlog launch party to celebrate start of Griffith Spring Fest

As anticipation builds for the upcoming Griffith Spring Fest, locals are invited to celebrate the festival's launch at the Medlog Launch Party on Friday, October 18, from 5pm to 8.30pm. The event will take place in the Griffith Tourism Hub Car Park, located at the corner of Banna and Jondaryan Ave. This family-friendly evening promises a vibrant atmosphere filled with live entertainment and a variety of local food and drinks for all ages. Best of all, entry to this exciting event is free. Attendees will have also the opportunity to admire the Real Juice Company Citrus Sculptures with ease while the street is closed to motorists. Unsafe trees along Railway Street to be removed

Griffith City Council will remove 27 Sugar Gum trees along Railway Street following an independent arborist's assessment that identified them as a public safety risk.

The removal process is scheduled to begin in approximately four weeks and is expected to take around three weeks to complete. The work will be carried out in stages, with barrier mesh and spotters in place to minimise disruption for motorists, pedestrians, and nearby businesses.

Council General Manager Brett Stonestreet emphasised the importance of public safety, noting that there have been multiple instances of falling limbs damaging vehicles. While the decision may not sit well with all community members, Mr Stonestreet reiterated that safety must come first. After the trees are removed, plans for replanting suitable tree species will be implemented, with new trees expected to be planted in May 2025. The removed trees, 14 located behind Memorial Park and 13 opposite CWA Park, will be replaced with semi-advanced species under irrigation, ensuring a safer and greener future for the area.



NSW Animal Welfare League Truck rolls into Griffith



The NSW Animal Welfare League's mobile animal care truck rolled into Griffith on Wednesday, 16 October, providing much-needed veterinary services for our community's furry residents. Around 70 cats and dogs benefited from the free services, which included pet health checks, microchipping, and vaccinations. Dog owners were able to access free vaccinations for their pets, while cats also received important immunisations, ensuring essential protection against diseases. The event, which was well-received by local pet owners, highlighted the importance of accessible veterinary care, ensuring that all pets in Griffith can stay healthy and happy.



Information about non-potable water supply

Griffith City Council reminds residents in the Local Government Area (LGA) about the importance of identifying and using non-potable (untreated) water, which is unsuitable for human consumption. Council supplies both potable and non-potable water to properties across Griffith, Yenda, Beelbanger, Bilbul, Hanwood, Lake Wyangan, Nericon, Yoogali, Warburn, Widgelli, and Tharbogang. It is essential for all residents, especially new property owners and tenants, to be aware of non-potable water on their properties. "Non-potable water is untreated, raw water sourced from the Main Canal, and

residents must understand its limitations," said Durgananda Chaudhary, Council's Water and Wastewater Manager. This untreated water should not be consumed or used for cooking, washing food, ice making, teeth cleaning, or bathing. Instead, it is for toilet flushing, garden irrigation, laundry, and domestic animals. Mr. Chaudhary urged landlords and tenants to clearly label non-drinking taps and inform visitors about these sources. Residents can identify non-potable supplies by checking their water meters for purple paint markings. For more information, contact Griffith City Council on 1300 176 077.
